

TELECONFERENCE SUPPORT GROUP FOR CARE PARTNERS OF PEOPLE WITH YOUNGER ONSET DEMENTIA

Younger onset dementia affects individuals younger than age 65. They and their families are facing special challenges related to changes associated with the disease, employment, raising children, money matters and future plans. Care partners are experiencing changes in the relationship, an increase in responsibilities related to the family and the challenge of providing care while continuing to be employed.

To assist care partners and friends of people with younger onset dementia, the Alzheimer Society of Manitoba is offering a teleconference support group. Group members must be caring for someone under the age of 65 with a diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease or another dementia.

Support Groups offer a confidential and supportive environment for participants to:

- Gain information about the nature and progression of Alzheimer's disease or another dementia, available treatments, and community resources.
- Discuss their experiences and strategies when caring for a person with Alzheimer's disease or another dementia.
- Enjoy mutual support from others who are caring for a family member or friend.

Teleconference Support Groups allow care partners or friends to participate without leaving their home. Participants can live anywhere in Manitoba. No special equipment is needed, though some people prefer being able to use a speaker phone or head set. Participants do not incur long distance charges. Connection is made using a toll free number and a conference code. The group will meet on a monthly basis.
